About Scout Portneuf Springs: Portneuf Springs is Grand Teton Council's newest Camp. Located west of Pocatello. It is nestled in the beautiful river valley of the Portneuf river with large poplar, cottonwood and Elm trees and plenty of space to have a great Scouting experience.

How to get to Scout Hollow: Going north from Idaho Falls towards Rexburg, on Hwy 20. Take exit 325 (just before the Snake River). Continue east on 4200 East for 1/2 mile. Turn left at Scout Lane to Scout Hollow.

How to get to Portneuf Springs: Traveling on I-86 just west of Pocatello. Take exit 58, turn north, then Left when the road Ts. Continue on Tank Farm Road about 1 mile then turn right onto Douglass Lane. **Address:** 1351 Douglass Lane, Pocatello, ID 83204
