## Qualifications to Attend Cedar Badge

To attend Cedar Badge, a youth must:

- Be registered with BSA (Boys and Girls)
- Be a First Class Scout (if attending Boy Scout or Varsity CB-NYLT, Boys only)
- Be age 14 by September 1 (if attending CB- Kodiak, Boys and Girls)
- > Have week-long camping experience
- > Be recommended by their unit or youth leader
